Dear Parents/Carers

Assalamu Alaikum

The autumn term is coming to an end this month. All the children and staff are looking forward to the holiday. Parents are requested to remind their children to continue reading at home for at least 15-20 minutes every day. Children should spend around an hour every day studying. Parents should encourage their children to write, read with an adult, test their understanding, and support them in making notes in their reading journals. Together, we can help our children take responsibility for their learning.

Coffee morning

During the coffee morning, which took place on 1 December 2023, many parents attended. We always listen to our parents, and together we try to resolve any issues that arises. Alhamdulillah, it was a very productive meeting. Almost everyone present praised the school and were very positive and happy with the school's performances. Regarding any payment issues, parents may see Mufti Hamza, our finance manager, in the office.

Attendance

During the autumn term, our attendance has increased to 96.20%. We would like to remind parents that children must come to school at 8am and be collected at 3.40pm. According to our attendance policy, if a child is persistently absent without authorisation (2 days in a 4-week period), parents will be fined £30 per child and must meet with the head teacher. The local authority may be involved, and this could result in dismissal from the school.

Punctuality

Children who arrive late twice or more within a two-week period will be considered persistently **late**. If the persistent lateness continues, the attendance officer will arrange a meeting with the head teacher and the parent. The school may fine £20 per child for persistent lateness. This may also result in disciplinary action by the head teacher.

Bake sale

We would like to thank our parents/carers for their contribution towards our bake sale. Alhamdulillah, we raised £640 which will be used towards purchasing resources.

Palestine

Alhamdulillah our children raised over £2,433 for Palestine which was collected by Ummah Welfare Trust. Jazaakumullah to all the children and their parents for their tremendous effort. Our children and staff have also completed the recitation of the Qur'an and we have been supplicating for our brothers and sisters in Palestine. We also participated in Palestine Awareness Week during the last week of November 2023. Please keep the ummah especially the people of Palestine in your duas.

Dear Parents/Carers Assalamu 'Alaikum

The children, teachers and parents have settled into a busy start to the new academic year. Let's pray for our children and the school, and hope we can build a strong foundation for learning, create a positive environment, a bright future for both here in this world and the hereafter. We trust that this has been a good first few weeks for all pupils. Around the school it has been a pleasure to see so many beaming faces as the children renew friendships, discover and enjoy learning with their new teachers. I would like to thank all the parents for participating in parents' day to meet the teachers and learn about their child's/children's attainment.

Attendance and punctuality

Please remember that children have to be at school at <u>8am</u> for morning assembly every day. The gate closes at <u>8:15am</u>, any children arriving after this time will be marked in as <u>LATE (L)</u>, and this will be reflected on their school report at the end of the year. It is crucial for children to come to school every day and on time. Parents are responsible for bringing them on time as this will help children maintain time management and discipline through their life. Persistent late or poor attendance may raise concerns, and repeated warnings result in a disciplinary meeting with the head teacher.

Holidays during term time

Never book a holiday during the term time. It disrupts children's learning and is hugely detrimental to their attainment.

The government is very serious about students being absent from school. It has introduced a fine of £60 for each child absent from the school during the term, which rises to £120 if they do not pay within 21 days. If you do not pay the fine after 28 days, you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school. Al-Falah started this fine from January 2023.

Parking

DO NOT park your car at the bus stop or in front of the school gate. Some parents unfortunately are not taking this seriously and are causing harm to the school, tarnishing our reputation as Muslims in the community.

Labelling clothes

Please label your child's school jumpers and cardigans as we have many jumpers and cardigans in our lost property which have not been collected.

Coffee morning

Parents coffee morning will take place on <u>Friday 1 December 2023</u> at <u>8.30am</u> in the head teacher's room. All parents/carers are invited

to join us to share their thoughts and ideas on how to improve the school or just join us to enjoy a hot drink.



It was surely a day to celebrate all our children and staff members' hard work. Messages from class teachers


Year 1 (Ms Thamina and Ms Fahmida)



Dear Parents/Carers

Assalamu Alaikum

We have had another jam-packed term full of incredible learning experiences across the school. I cannot help but beam with pride at the fantastic learning I can see taking place every day. As in every newsletter, you will find lots of news and information about events below. Have a wonderful break!

Attendance and punctuality: Please remember that children have to be at school at 8am for morning assembly every day. Once the gate closes at 8:15am, any children arriving after this time are marked in as LATE. Their attendance and punctuality will be shown on their school report at the end of the year. Parents/guardians are responsible for making sure their children come to school every day and on time.

Holidays during term time

The government is very serious about students being absent from school. It has introduced a fine of £60 for each child absent from the school during the term, which rises to £120 if they do not pay within 21 days. If you do not pay the fine after 28 days, you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school. Al-Falah has started this fine from January.

<u>Parking:</u> We would like to express our appreciation and give huge thanks to one of our parents (Samira, mother of Mohammed Abdullahi, Y2) for volunteering in the morning and afternoon at the school gate. She places traffic cones and maintains the area so that parents no longer park their cars in front of the gate.

If driving to drop off or collect your children from school, all drivers must avoid parking at the school gate and bus stop. There are still a few parents who are not taking this seriously and are causing harm to the school, tarnishing our representation as Muslims in the community.

<u>Coffee morning</u>: Our spring term coffee morning will be held on 10th March 2023. This will be arranged in the head teacher's office from 8:30am to 9:00am. It will be an opportunity for parents to discuss any issues and suggestions whilst enjoying a hot beverage.

<u>SATs:</u> The Year 6 SATs exams are fast approaching and will be held the week of May 9th, 2023. School will be closed for the Easter and Ramadan holiday (Monday 10th April to Monday 24th April 2023) just 2 weeks before their SATs. 

Year 1 - Ms Thamina& Ms Fahmida



Dear Parents/Carers

Assalamu Alaikum

You will receive an outline of the curriculum overview at the beginning of the Spring term which shows what the teacher is planning to teach your child over the term.

<u>Coffee morning:</u> We were very pleased to see a great turnout on the parent's coffee morning. Parents were given the opportunity to share their thoughts and ideas on how to improve the school. We, as a school, value your opinions and all feedback will be taken onboard.

Waiting/parking outside the school

We are tired of telling some parents/carers not to park or wait outside the school gates on the zigzag lines and bus stop. These same parents/carers are giving a bad name to the school and Islam. They are being sinful for causing inconvenience to others and putting our children's lives at risk.

We will start taking pictures of such cars and this will have consequences, and in some cases, this may even result in removal of their children. We will NOT tolerate any abuse towards school staff or any volunteers who may ask you to move your vehicle.

Scarlet Fever guidelines for schools:

Scarlet fever is caused by bacteria called group A streptococci. It is usually a mild illness, but is highly infectious. The increase is likely related to high amounts of circulating bacteria and social mixing.

Be extra vigilant of the signs and symptoms of scarlet fever which include sore throat, high temperature, headache and fever, along with a fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel. On darker skin, the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel.

Schools and early years settings should ensure that all children with confirmed or suspected group A strep infections (mainly scarlet fever and also tonsillitis) are kept away from school until they've been treated with antibiotics for 24 hours.

Contact NHS 111 or your GP if you suspect your child has scarlet fever. Early treatment of scarlet fever with antibiotics is important to reduce the risk of complications such as pneumonia or a bloodstream infection.

There is no vaccine against group A strep. The main preventive measures are good hand and respiratory hygiene. Children should wash their hands properly with soap for 20 seconds, use a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes, and keep away from others when feeling unwell.

We will be holding small end of term class parties on Thursday 15th December 2023. Please provide children with any snacks/treats for them to share with their classmates.

Ms Mehz gave many years of commitment at Al-Falah and has had a tremendously positive impact on the school. We are grateful for her contributions and will miss her. 
Messages from teachers

Thank you to all parents for continuing to ensure children are completing their homework, spellings and practicing their reading. Well done Year 2!


Year 3 - Ms Abedah



Dear Parents/Carers

Assalamu Alaikum

The children, teachers and parents have settled into a busy start of the new academic year. Let's hope and pray for our children and school that we can build a strong foundation of learning, create a positive environment, a bright future and a good preparation for both here in this world and the hereafter. We trust that this has been a good first few weeks for all pupils. Around school it has been a pleasure to see so many beaming faces as the children renew friendships, discover and enjoy learning with their new teachers. I would like to thank all the parents for participating in parents' day to meet the teachers and learn about their child's/children's attainment.

Attendance and punctuality: Please remember that children have to be at school at <u>8am</u> for morning assembly every day. Once the gate closes at <u>8:15am</u>, any children arriving after this time are marked in as <u>LATE (L)</u>. Their attendance and punctuality will be shown on their school report at the end of the year. It is crucial for children to come to school every day and on time. Parents are responsible for bringing them on time as this will help children maintain time management and discipline through their life. Persistent late or poor attendance may raise concerns and repeat warnings result in a disciplinary meeting with the headteacher.

Remember! Never book a holiday during the term time. It disrupts children's learning and is hugely detrimental to their attainment.

Lunch box: Please remember to send your child's lunch box with them. Arrange to drop off lunch for your child if it is forgotten as the school is not responsible for providing any lunch for the children.

Behaviour: In Al Falah we aim to provide a calm, safe and supportive environments where children and young people want to attend and where they can learn and thrive. We promote positive behaviours by proactively supporting pupils to behave appropriately. Pupils need to know that they have a duty to follow the school behaviour policy and uphold the school rules, and should contribute to the school culture.

To support the school, parents should be encouraged to get to know the school's behaviour policy (school's website) and, where possible, take part in the life of the school and its culture. 


different ways of melting the ice or even breaking it!

So after 3 days, 'Abdullah told him the real reason why he requested to stay with him, and said I heard the Prophet (s) say three times that a man from the people of Paradise was coming to us and then you came. I thought I should stay with you to see what you are doing that I should follow, but I did not see you do anything special. Why did the Prophet speak highly of you?" The man said, "I am as you have seen." When Abdullah was about to leave, the man said, "I am as you have seen, except that every night, before I go to sleep, I forgive whoever has wronged me. I remove any bad feelings towards anyone from my heart." (Musnad Ahmad)



Covid-19 update

From Tuesday 14 December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 is being introduced (including until the end of this term). All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 - whether Omicron or not - should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19.




Year 1 - Ms Thamina
